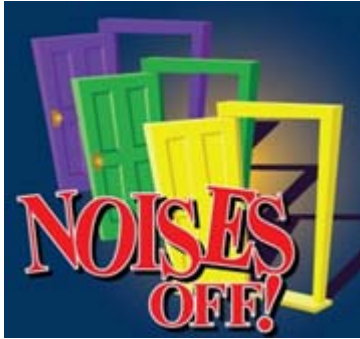

Devotional & Church News

What do you give to God that you think might please Him? Is there anything that you can offer which He might need? No, of course not. All creation appeared at the sound of His voice. How about advice? Could you suggest to Him a better way to run the world? After all, look at the mess it's in. Consider, though, when God made the world it was "good", even "very good". (Genesis 1:25 & 31) We messed it up and continue to do so. So again, I'll ask, maybe rephrasing the question, does good desire anything from us? To that question we can answer a definite yes! We know that He cherishes our love for Him and for others. He commends us in our obedience to Him. But these acts of love and obedience can all be linked together under one general heading - sacrifices!

The Bible tells us in Psalms 57:17 that "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and a contrite heart, O God, you will not despise." (NASB) To better understand the impact of this verse of Scripture it would be to our benefit to focus, if only for a moment, on the word "contrite." It's not a word we find ourselves using in normal everyday speech. By definition it means "penitent." More specifically, a penitent and sorrowful heart. Sorrowful over the sin(s) we have committed against a loving Father. More than just being sorry. More than just wanting to be a better person or even a better Christian.

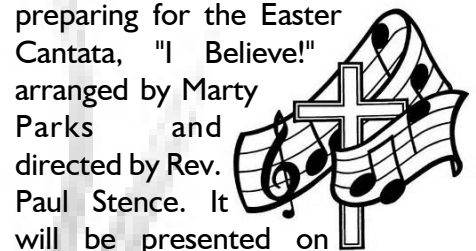
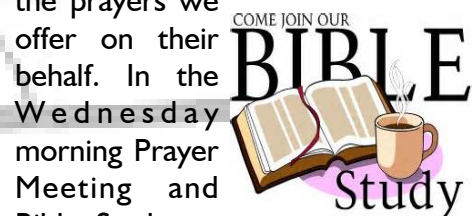
Our broken heartedness comes to us when we come to God, and in the presence of His holiness we get a vision of just how wicked and sinful our nature is. It is in this state of brokenness that we repent. It is in this state of brokenness that we come face to face with our shattered lives. It is in this state of brokenness that reality dawns on us that we are quite incapable of putting these broken pieces of our lives back together. And it is in this state of brokenness that God loves us most. Not because we are broken but because we recognize our wretched state and ask, even plead, for His forgiveness.

He freely gives us this much needed forgiveness, mends the shattered and fragile pieces of our lives, regenerates the dead spirit we have been dragging around with us and adopts us as His very own dear children. He eagerly waits for us to come to Him so that He (and He alone) can repair the damaged goods that have been our existence since the Garden of Eden. His loving concern, caring hands and complete compassion for us overwhelms us and we can sing in full voice from a healed heart and a spirit of repentance "Just as I am without one plea; but that Thy blood was shed for me; and as Thou bidst me to Thee, O Lamb of God I come, I come," broken heart, shattered pieces, empty lives and all. Bring your own brokenness and your contrite (penitent, sorrow-filled) heart to Jesus and be healed.

We praise God and thank Him for His blessings to our chapel and to our community. On March 1 we will observe "Missionary Sunday" during which all monetary offerings will go
