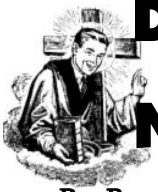

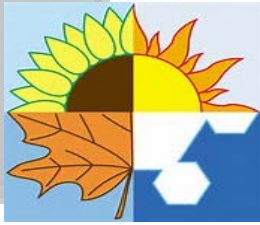


Devotional & Church News

What time is it? We can answer that question by any number of ways. We can look at a clock, a watch or any other timepiece and declare the hour of the day. We can see by the altering light

that it is daytime or nighttime. We can discern the changing of the seasons such



as summertime, wintertime or springtime. Likewise we determine by the change in weather patterns if it is planting time or harvesting time. Days and months drift by. Years pass with a flourish and a discomfoting speed. Then one day we wake up and realize that we are running out of time. Youthful exuberance is gone. Accomplishments can only be spoken of in the past tense. So we wonder, and we question, "Where did it all go? How have I lived? (Did I live a good life?) Why must it all end so soon?"

Not easy questions to answer. Not comfortable questions to even entertain. But there they are, staring us in the face, startling us into a reality we've tried ever so desperately to ignore. And yet our entire lifespan, whatever that span may be, is little more than a blip on the celestial timepiece of God's calendar. Too often given to despair when thinking that most of our life is behind us we fail in only one aspect. We forget God's promises to bring us into a new and better life. There is

Mother's Day

A holiday honoring motherhood that is observed in different forms throughout the world. The American incarnation of Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis in 1908 and became an official U.S. holiday in 1914. Jarvis would later denounce the holiday's commercialization and spent the latter part of her life trying

to remove it from the calendar. While dates and celebrations vary, Mother's Day most commonly falls on the second Sunday in May and traditionally involves presenting mothers with flowers, cards and other gifts.

Water

Run your car without water in the radiator, and it will come to a steaming halt. Yet people who wouldn't dream of letting their cars run dry often walk around without enough water in their own radiators. And because every cell in the body requires fluids to dissolve and transport vitamins, minerals, sugar and other chemicals, not drinking enough water can leave you feeling like a run-down Ford.

The average person loses about 2 percent of his body weight (about 1½ quarts of water) in urine, perspiration, and other body fluids every day. To replace these fluids, doctors advise drinking at least eight glasses of



water, milk or juice a day. More if you're a large person, over age 55, sick with a cold, or simply active. To make sure you drink enough, the brain has special sensors in a part of the brain called the thalamus, which monitor blood levels of sodium. When concentrations of sodium rise, it means that water levels are low. The brain then sends a signal in the form of thirst that says it's time to head to the water cooler.

You will be asked to provide your name, address, acct# (optional), phone number, e-mail address, pole number (or address nearest to the pole), reason (drop down menu...light out, flickering on & off, etc.)

After you send it, you should receive an e-mail confirmation & phone message with a report number and when it will be repaired.

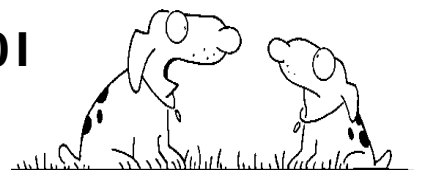
