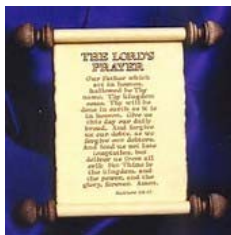
# Devotional & Church News

June is considered to be the most desirable month of the year for a young woman to get married. (Evidently the young man in her life has no say in the matter.) In many instances being a June bride is the fanciful dream of teenage girls. Where does the idea of a June bride come from? Tradition! How did it originate? I really don't know. Someone else will have to enlighten us on the subject. Now there is nothing wrong with this tradition; likewise with several other observances. Did you ever wonder why people count it as a taboo to break certain traditions, or simply fail to honor them?

There are many traditions in our weekly worship service that have, to a degree, become mundane, routine, and without any spiritual benefit. A vain repetition that does not honor God or uplift the spirit of the worshiper. For instance, (and please hold your judgment on my next few comments until you have heard all that I intend to say) we recite the "Lord's Prayer" every Sunday. Why? Tradition! There's no commandment in the Bible requiring us to do so. Jesus' uttering these words was a spontaneous response to the disciple's request to "teach us HOW to pray." (Luke 11:1) Again, there is nothing inherently wrong with this



tradition until it becomes a banal recitation devoid of all truly personal communication with the Father. Likewise, merely mouthing the words of the Apostle's Creed is not necessarily an affirmation of our faith. Just a reflection of our capacity to memorize. We are exhorted to renew our minds daily in Christ (Romans 12:2) God's desire is to keep us fresh in His love. "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are NEW every morning; great is Your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23) Why do we celebrate the birth of Christ of December 25?

Tradition! No one truly knows His exact date of birth. Why do we call the resurrection of the Lord E a s t e r ? Tradition! It sounds a lot like the name of the fertility goddess Ishtar, whose symbol was the rabbit. So are we then to do away with any and all traditions? No, of course not. But it is my prayer for you that you attach the proper heartfelt meaning to each one. Traditions sometimes bring comfort and stability to a weary soul. If you want to pray and don't know how, the Lord's Prayer is most helpful. To articulate the foundation of your faith the Apostle's Creed or the Nicene Creed can be beneficial. Observances of Holy Days require us to reflect on the compassion and loving kindness of our Creator. My sole purpose in addressing traditions is that the original meaning, the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, will not depart from your act of worship. At best we are but feeble creatures in



the sight of God. One tradition (if it can be called that) is His desire to be worshiped in spirit and in truth. (John 4:23-24)

We are pleased that many of our dear friends continue to worship and fellowship with us each Sunday morning throughout the summer months. Every week, every message, every hymn brings a blessing of its own. On June 14 we will celebrate God in song throughout the service. This is our semi-annual "Singspiration." It is a service without regular preaching but the gospel message is rendered through the inspiration of hymns of praise and is often accompanied by a brief historical background of how God worked through the Holy Spirit in the lives of individuals to produce such beautiful words and music. The message, therefore, is in the song itself. Martin Luther is believed to have said that "Preaching is the highest form of worship and singing praises to God is the second highest form of worship." God has blessed us with the ability and desire to do both for His honor and His glory. You are invited to join us each week at 10:30 AM in clubhouse #2. God bless you with an abundance of His mercies. And best wishes to any June brides getting married this year and to those celebrating their anniversary.

## **A Great Idea!**

Nothing is considered as quintessentially English as a cup of tea. A lot of people know that tea was first grown in China, and then taken to India by the British. But did you know that the tea bag was accidentally invented by tea merchant Thomas Sullivan in New York City in June 1908? In an attempt to cut his costs, Mr. Sullivan sent samples of tea leaves to potential customers in small silk pouches. His customers weren't sure what to do with the little bags of tea, so they dunked them in a cup of



hot water.

And that's how the tea bag was born. After complaints that the silk mesh was too fine, Thomas Sullivan developed little sachets made of gauze, and this was instrumental in the design of today's tea bag which can be found in stores and supermarkets all over the world. It wasn't until 1953 that the British tea producer Tetley spotted the commercial potential of the tea bag. The company now sells around 200 million tea bags every week. But, if it wasn't for a handful of confused Americans, the convenient tea bag may never have made it into our cups!

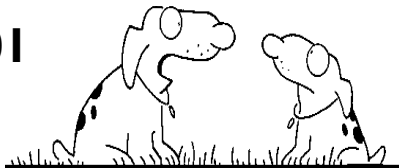
