moved in our park. Just 2 or 3 things to bring to your attention: every cart operator must have a driver's license to drive a golf cart and your address is to be printed on the driver's side of the cart. It is required that carts and bikes have working lights on them at night. Children are not allowed to drive golf carts at any time. Sherwood Forest property stops at the guard shack; you may be ticketed or be fined if you go beyond that point.

Permits are required before beginning additions to your home. If not, code enforcement can fine you or make you take it down.

Camp fires nor burning of trash is allowed in the park - not even in a fire pit.

Dogs that are not allowed in Sherwood Forest: Pit-bulls, Rottweilers, and German Shepherds. Have a voice and join the H.O.A. Please contact any board member for more information. Thank You.

I feel honored to serve such a leader who loves us. Join us and let's celebrate Him; He is worthy. Remain in God and seek His face always."

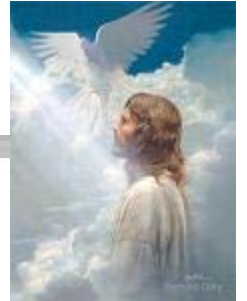
This is the same Jesus that we preach and teach every Sunday. It is the only

volunteers, AGFT needs the following: Loose leaf paper packages, 24-count crayons, 8-count marker packages, glue sticks, 12-count colored pencil packages.

- **A New Beginning Pet Rescue:** newbeginning.petfinder.org A New Beginning Pet Rescue, Inc. has been rescuing and finding homes for unwanted pets since July 2001. They do not have a "public shelter". Instead they have a network of foster homes that help take care of the homeless pets until they can find permanent homes for them. Their Mission Statement is to provide safe, temporary housing and medical care, as needed, to rescued pets. To provide care until permanent placement with new families can be found. To promote the no-kill philosophy for future generations by guaranteeing each pet's sterility. To accept donations and contributions to support the organization's stated goals. Along with adoptive and foster families, volunteers and cash donations, they also need: 12,200

btu air-conditioners, contractor garbage bags, bleach and gently used towels.

Watering Tips - Did You Know?

The best time to water your lawn is between 4am and 7am. This reduces evaporation and wind drift which can amount to 50% loss of applied water. It also reduces the chance of mold and fungus by allowing the leaf blades to dry in the sun.

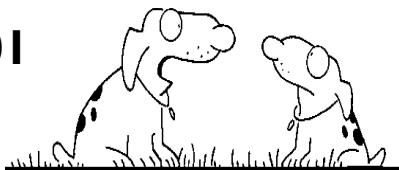
Please pick up after your pet! It's the law! Some people still don't clean up after their dogs. Everyone must clean up after their pets.
