We still need help getting the word out to everyone in the park, that it's time to join the H.O.A. The cost is \$10.00 a year to join the H.O.A. Right now approximately 148 paid members out of 700 plus residents make the decisions. We need help from all residents of the park; please join your H.O.A. in 2015. Come on, it's only \$10.00 a year. Everyone in the park should be signing up. It is mandatory to join in other parks so show us your support now. Please fill out the application in the paper and give it a board member. Talk to the other residents and get them to join. The more members we have the better it is for everyone. Please read all the rules and regulation that you all sign when you moved in our park. Just 2 or 3 things to bring to your attention: every cart

operator must have a driver's license to drive a golf cart and your address is to be printed on the driver's side of



the cart. It is required that carts and bikes have working lights on them at night. Children are not allowed to drive golf carts at any time. Sherwood Forest property stops at the guard shack; you may be ticketed or be fined if you go beyond that point.

Permits are required before beginning additions to your home. If not, code enforcement can fine you or make you take it down.

Camp fires nor burning of trash is allowed in the park - not even in a fire pit.

Dogs that are not allowed in Sherwood Forest: Pit-bulls, Rottweilers, and German Shepherds. Have a voice and join the H.O.A. Please contact any board member for more information. Thank You.

## Devotional & Church News

Today I woke up feeling almost as exhausted as I did when I went to bed. There is no apparent reason for this tiredness since I slept a reasonable number of hours. But you can't deny that feeling of fatigue no matter when it strikes you. There seems to be more to it than can be explained by a mere lack of physical energy. As I reflected on the past week (or couple of weeks) I soon realized that my daily schedule has been filled with busyness. Taking time to help other people is always a refreshing delight. So that can't be blamed. Maybe I've been getting too much prescription medication but the doctors don't think so. Studying, preparing and reviewing sermons for Sunday morning gives me a welcomed sensation of spiritual growth. That, too, cannot be considered a primary cause. Emotional stress can also be ruled out. So what has made me feel so drained lately? I won't blame declining physical activity, diet, or simply the results of aging (although all of the things mentioned could be contributing factors).

So I took it to the Lord to inquire as to why I am so out of sorts lately. Then it dawned on me. That is precisely the problem. I had been neglectful in taking it to the Lord everyday, even though I have encouraged people to do so. Yes, I prayed, read/studied the Bible, tried to be helpful by showing love and concern, and doing all those things that Christ commands His children to do. It wasn't what I was doing but what I was failing to do. "Come to Me all who are weary and

heavy laden and I will give you REST." (Matthew 11:28/NASB) That seems to be the answer. Resting in the Lord! But resting in the Lord doesn't mean idleness or negligence or slothfulness or laziness. It also doesn't mean sleep nor is it confined in definition to our eternal rest in paradise. So what is this rest Jesus speaks of? I believe it is a sharing of the responsibility of God's kingdom. To understand, we need to look at the remainder of that chapter in Matthew. "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart and you will find REST for our souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light." (Matthew 11:29-30)

When Jesus speaks of a yoke He is talking about a (wooden) harness that is shared by two. It is extremely difficult to carry it by oneself. The Lord is asking us to share in bringing the Kingdom of His Father to others on earth. When we try to do it by ourselves it quickly becomes an overwhelming, even impossible, task. When God placed man (Adam) in the garden it was to work in it and take care of it. God created it, so did He need man's help to maintain it? Absolutely not. He wanted us to share in the joy of His creation, to work with Him. That was His sovereign desire and will. Likewise, Jesus wants us to share in His work of redemption. Simply put, He wants us to bring His message of salvation to His people through His people. As we share that common yoke remember that the load is unevenly distributed and Jesus always carries the heavier side of the load. Be encouraged as you praise God for the opportunity to share in His work. As Paul wrote to the Galatians, "Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary." (Galatians 6:9.NASB) Yes, we were

meant to work, but not alone! September is a pivotal month for us at Sherwood Community Chapel. It marks the end of summer and the completion of another year of service to this community. On September 13 we will observe our 28th anniversary with church service followed by our anniversary dinner at Red Lobster. On that special Sunday we will welcome a guest speaker, Dr. Carol Erb (daughter-in-law of Walter Erb). Dr. Erb is the founder and director of the Beaufort Center for Marriage (a Christian counseling center). Carol is a board certified Christian counselor and marriage coach, an inspirational speaker, an active member of the Beaufort Chamber of Commerce, and a member of the American Association of Christian Counseling, the National Association of Christian Counselors and the International Christian Coaching Association. She has received awards for her work in Christian Counseling and is the author of the book titled "Enveloped," her own story of depression, defeat, deliverance and final victory through the love of Jesus. She is the mother of three sons and lives with her husband, Walt, in Beaufort, South Carolina.

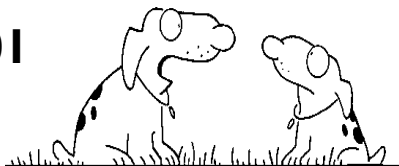
