Please read all the rules and regulations that you all signed when you moved in our park. Just 2 or 3 things to bring to your attention: you must have a driver's license to drive a golf cart at any time and you need to put your address on the driver's side of your cart. Carts have lights that work at night, bikes need lights on them at night; no children are allowed to drive any golf carts at any time. Sherwood Forest property **STOPS AT THE GUARD SHACK**, you can get a **TICKET OR A FINE**. You need to get a permit to do any addition on your home. If you don't get one, code enforcement can fine you or make you take it down. No burning of trash or camp fire allowed in the park not even in a fire pit.

No Pit-Bull, Rottweiler, German Shepherds, Chows or Doberman

dogs are allowed in the park. You need to have your address numbers on your home.

Devotional & Church News

The time is fast approaching for that period on our calendars that we call the "holiday season." I can't explain the feeling that it seems to come faster every year, arriving at an incomprehensible speed. But when you look at the clock and then at the calendar the pace is not altered. The clock ticks away one second at a time. The seasons change exactly on schedule. The earth rotates neither faster nor slower. Sun, moon, and stars confirm their rightful places in the heavens. So why do we have a sensation of speed. That apparently has only to do with our own mind set. Evidence proves that all of nature continues at the same unimpeded rate.

I believe the biggest detriment to our sense of timeliness is anxiety. We are anxious to see things occur. We can hardly wait to see who will win the World Series, or what teams will play in the Super Bowl. We look forward to and also dread the arrival of Christmas with all of its busyness. Thanksgiving comes and goes almost unnoticed as merchants more and more use Halloween as the catalyst for displaying their Christmas merchandise, advertising sale after sale. Black Friday is becoming more important than Easter Sunday, the triumphant victory of Christ over death and the grave. We just can't wait to get to the next big event so we can complain about how fast time flies and how little we were able to accomplish.

We are increasingly unsatisfied with life, current events, troublesome times, turbulent political unrest, and a sense of security that is daily threatened. We even lament that peace is unobtainable in our time, in our day. And so the anxiety builds. Within the Christian community many will shout, "we need a revival!" True to an extent but our sin disease goes deeper. We need a "reformation!!" A return to the gospel. We need preachers to boldly proclaim the truth of scripture and stop watering it down with compromise to accommodate world opinions. Most of all we need to once again return to our first love. And our first love is Jesus. People, even in the church, simply don't have a true love for Jesus. The Lord warned the church at Ephesus, "But this I have against you, that you have left your first love." (Revelation 2:4) Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. He is the good shepherd. He is the door to heaven. He is our redeemer, savior Lord and master. He is our brother and our King. No one comes to the Father except through Him. He came to give us life and to give it more abundantly. He will remove all of our anxiety if we can learn to trust His promise. "If I go away to prepare a place for you, I will come back and receive you to Myself, so that where I am you may be also." (Matthew 14:3) Now that is something to look forward to. In fact, it is the only thing that is worth our time to consider. Eternity with Jesus is the reality that blesses our souls. Eternity without Him is the destiny of all unbelievers who refuse His invitation. In the meantime our job as believer is to share not just the love OF Jesus with others, but to also

share the love FOR Jesus. Listen to these solemn words from scripture: "Anxiety in a man's heart weighs it down, but a good word makes it glad." (Proverbs 12:25) And in the New Testament we read: "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6) Anxiety is a tool of the devil. Don't let him use it against you.

Choir practice has begun. We invite everyone to join in singing praises to our God in worship each Sunday as we also prepare a new Christmas cantata that will bless your hearts. Coming up next month is Harvest Home on Saturday, November 21 in CH#2 and the Christmas Child Shoe Box campaign. We begin the weekly Prayer Meeting and Bible Study on Wednesday, October 14 at 10:15 AM. The First half of the year our study will be on "Suffering And The Sovereignty Of God," a twelve-part lesson prepared by Rev. R. C. Sproul, Jr. The monthly Prayer Breakfast starts on Saturday, October 10 at 8:00 AM in Bob Evans Restaurant. And the semi-annual General Board meeting will be on Monday, October 12 at 10:00 AM. Please join us for worship and fellowship each Sunday morning at 10:30 AM. In all things, love Jesus!
