side of your cart. Carts have lights that work at night, bikes need lights on them at night; no children are allowed to drive any golf carts at any time. Sherwood Forest property **STOPS AT THE GUARD SHACK.** You can get a **TICKET OR A FINE** if you drive your cart past the guard shack. All golf carts must have your address # on it. Anyone walking at night needs to carry a flashlight. Anyone that has a car, truck, or any motor vehicle without plates need to register them at motor vehicle or they will be towed away.

YOU need to get a permit to do any addition on your home. If you don't get one code enforcement can fine you or make you take it down.

No burning of trash or camp fire allowed in the park - not even in a fire pits.

No Pit-bull, Rottweiler, German Shepherds, Chows or Dobermans dogs are allowed in the park. You need to have your addresses numbers on your home.

Devotional & Church News

This month's message is very personal, more personal than any I have written. It is a celebration of sorts. It was on the first Sunday in February that I became the Senior Pastor of Sherwood Community Chapel in 2006, thus making this our (Cathy and me) 10th anniversary of ministry to the church and service to the community. Rev. Earl Deetz, founding Pastor of the chapel, had passed away early Christmas morning, 2005, thereby creating a need for a new servant to carry on the work he began.

As you can imagine these past ten years have been both a blessing and a challenge. We are blessed with so many new friends we've grown to know and to love. One of the greatest challenges to our faith has been to say good-bye to too many of these beloved friends, to conduct memorial services in their memory, and to try to bring some measure of comfort to those left behind. There has been special moments of triumph and causes to celebrate too numerous to remember. God keeps adding to our numbers as he calls others home. Some have left to return to their roots to live out their final days closer to family. That is certainly understandable, even though we miss their company somewhat selfishly. The experiences have altogether been a growing experience for both of us. Executing the responsibilities of the church can be intimidating but also delightful. When God appeared to Solomon in

a vision He granted Solomon a promise to give him whatever he asked for. Solomon humbly asked for wisdom to lead and rule this great nation, Israel. Although God had never appeared to me in this manner I have nonetheless prayed for a special gift - that of a pure heart. My favorite verse of Scripture is Psalm 51:10: "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me." (NASB) The pure heart is a work in progress while a steadfast spirit is the striving for holiness. Both elements will probably never be realized this side of the grave. Yet it is a goal worth pursuing. The journey is uplifting, the strain bearable, the rewards unsurpassed. No other gift can be quite as refreshing and intimate as the gift of serving Christ in love.


Discouragement knocks at the door, temptations seize my mind, the burden of setting a "good example" overwhelms me at times. But it is these testings that foster growth and maturity. I can easily recognize my shortcomings as a minister, but by the grace of God, and only by His grace, am I able to continue. What a tremendous blessing to be surrounded by so many Godly people. I am so thankful for the patience and tolerance they have shown me, affording me the

opportunity to realize growth and maturity. Since God isn't done with me yet I pray that the good people of this church will likewise allow me to continue on serving, ministering, preaching, teaching, visiting and growing into the mature Christian He fashions all of us to become. Sanctification is a never ending process. Join me on the journey. "It will be worth it all when we see Jesus."

This month we begin a new Bible Study series titled "The New Birth," by Steven J. Lawson. Being "born again" is a term we use too casually. We need to give serious thought to the depths of rebirth. The choir is practicing the Easter Cantata, "Come And See" to be presented on Palm Sunday (March 20) and Easter Sunday (March 27). We will also be attending the 3-day National Conference by Ligonier Ministries from February 25 - 27 at the First Baptist Church in Orlando. February 13 is our next scheduled Prayer Breakfast held the second Saturday of each month from October thru May at Bob Evans Restaurant beginning at 8:00 AM. We are hoping to see you at the regular Sunday morning service in Clubhouse #2 at 10:30 AM. God bless you in your life in the spirit.

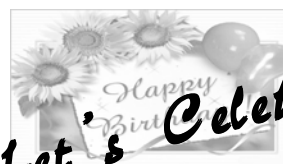
