Devotional & Church News

In the opening verses of the book of Revelation the Apostle John writes, "To the seven churches in Asia. Grace and peace to you from the One who is, who was, and who is coming; from the seven spirits before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the first born from the dead and the ruler of the kings of the earth.

To him who loves us and has set us free from our sins by his blood, and made us a kingdom, priests to His God and Father - the glory and dominion are his forever and ever. Amen

Look! He is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see Him, including those who pierced Him. And all the families of the earth will mourn over Him. *This is certain.* Amen

'I am the Alpha and the Omega,' says the Lord God, 'the One who is, who was, and who is coming, the Almighty.'" (Revelation 1:4-8 HCSB)

Last month I shared with you the joy of receiving our first great-grandchild into the world. But like many parents, grandparents, and great-grandparents I wonder what kind of world we will leave for those who follow us. So far it doesn't look like a good one. We've become so focused on the problems surrounding us (and there are many) that we've failed to share with our offspring the one and only true solution - *Jesus Christ!* Not a better philosophy, not a better education, not better science, not better technology, not

better laws, not better politics, not better armies, but a person. The living Son of God. In this we have failed miserably. In not teaching the next generations that there is a hope, a future, a deliverance from sin and violence, a glorious future, we have given them tunnel vision. A very discouraging future to look at with no possible remedy. Yet there is hope, there is glorious hope. People who clamor for peace continually denounce the "Prince of Peace" and vainly try to solve man's woes on their own merit. But all of our man-made efforts only reinforce the depravity of mankind.

Yes, we must strive to attain peace here and now but the day is coming when we will have abandoned all hope. It may be at that most unexpected time that Christ will appear. In the verses I quoted from Revelation at the beginning three times in five verses Jesus says, "I am coming." Will we look forward to His appearance or we will ignore it to our sorrow? Worst of all, will we teach our children that Christ is anything but who He says He is. Will we teach them that the Bible is wrong or will we just ignore His coming altogether? In either case the results will be the same - *eternal damnation!*

And why is Jesus coming again? For two main reasons: (1) He is coming for you and for me, and all who believe in His name, to take us to live in heaven with Him permanently, and (2) He's coming to put an end to all sin by judging the wicked and all who reject Him and defeating forever God's enemies. We can leave our heritage with the hope of a better life, a resurrected life, a life filled with joy and peace,

freed from all the turmoil caused by sin. The idea that Jesus is coming is so important that John ends these prophetic writings with the same theme He began. "Look, I am coming quickly!" (Rev. 22:7) and again in verse 20, "Yes, I am coming quickly." Are you and your children ready for His coming? If not we have lots of work to do. A better life may not be in this world as we know it but a better life is coming.

We were pleased to welcome John and Vivian McDonald on Sunday, July 10 for our "Singspiration" service. They beautifully combine the meaningful words of gospel music with personal testimony. Each Sunday morning we will continue with the study of I Corinthians, a church steeped in many sinful practices and how God dealt with each one through the Apostle Paul. This is a vivid reflection of the church in the United States today. We need to boldly, lovingly proclaim God's truth throughout the country. It is the only hope for our nation. Please join us each Sunday at 10:30 AM in clubhouse #2 for worship, inspired singing, and fellowship. God bless you all as you prepare daily for Christ's return.

2016 SALES TAX HOLIDAY

Florida's 2016 Back to School Sales Tax Holiday begins Friday, August 5 and ends Sunday, August 7, 2016. During this sales tax holiday period, Florida law directs that no sales tax or local option tax (also known as discretionary sales surtax) will be collected on purchases of:

- Clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item, and
- Certain school supplies selling for \$15 or less per item.
