# THE SHERWOOD FOREST H.O.A. BOARD

6. Overnight parking on lawns, vacant lots or in the street is not allowed.

7. You are not allowed to work on your cars in your driveway at any time.

## Devotional & Church News

A few weeks ago I read the following article in church. I thought it was worth passing on to those who were not in attendance that day.

*"IF I WERE THE DEVIL... If I were the Prince of Darkness, I'd want to engulf the whole world in darkness. And I'd have a third of its real estate, and four-fifths of its population, but I wouldn't be happy until I had seized the ripest apple on the tree. So I'd set about however necessary to take over the United States. I'd subvert the churches first - I'd begin with a campaign of whispers. With the wisdom of a serpent, I would whisper to you as I whispered to Eve: 'Do as you please.'*

*"To the young, I would whisper that the 'the Bible is a myth.' I would convince them that man created God instead of the other way around. I would confide that what's bad is good, and what's good is 'square.' And the old, I would teach to pray, after me, 'Our Father, which are in Washington...'*

*"And then I'd get organized. I'd educate authors in how to make lurid literature exciting, so that anything else would appear dull and uninteresting. I'd threaten TV with dirtier movies and vice versa. I'd pedal narcotics to whom I could. I'd sell alcohol to ladies and gentlemen of distinction. I'd tranquilize the rest with pills.*

*"If I were the devil I'd soon have families at war with themselves, churches at war with themselves, and nations at war with themselves, until each in its turn was consumed. And*

*with promises of higher ratings I'd have mesmerizing media fanning the flames. If I were the devil I would encourage schools to refine young intellects, but neglect to discipline emotions - just let those run wild, until before you knew it, you'd have to have drug sniffing dogs and metal detectors at every schoolhouse door.*

*"Within a decade I'd have prisons overflowing. I'd have judges promoting pornography - soon I could evict God from the courthouse, then from the schoolhouse, and then from the houses of Congress. And in His own churches I would substitute psychology for religion, and deify science. I would lure priests and pastors into misusing boys and girls, and church money. If I were the devil I'd make the symbols of Easter an egg and the symbol of Christmas a bottle.*

*"If I were the devil I'd take from those who have and give to those who wanted until I had killed the incentive of the ambitious. And what do you bet? I could get whole states to promote gambling as the way to get rich? I would caution against extremes and hard work in Patriotism, in moral conduct. I would convince the young that marriage is old-fashioned, that swinging is more fun, and that what you see on TV is the way to be. And thus I could undress you in public and then lure you into bed with diseases for which there is no cure. In other words, if I were the devil I would keep right on doing what he's doing."*

This is the transcript of a radio message given by Paul Harvey in 1965. His prophecies are eerily accurate even if they are incomplete. I don't think he could have even imagined the promotion of same-sex marriage, the wholesale slaughter on demand of innocent, unborn

babies in the millions, the brutality and expansion of street violence, a government that is bloated beyond belief, unrestrained welfare, and the proliferation of illegal immigrants, just to name a few more problems that we face as a nation. More than ever before we need to pray for America, **pray for America, PRAY FOR AMERICA!**

As the questions go, if not us then who, if not now then when. Someday it will be too late. Whom will we blame for the sad state of affairs? Don't look around. Because everywhere you look you will see someone who failed this country starting with the image in the mirror. We sing "America, God shed His grace on thee!" Oh that He would do that again in abundance. Until then we get the county we deserve because we have turned our back on the One who gave us His grace.

## Discarding Prescriptions

Here's a safety tip from your government: Trash those unwanted prescription drugs with kitty litter or coffee grounds to keep them from falling into the wrong hands - and mouths.

Federal prescription-drug disposal guidelines recommend mixing unused, unneeded or expired drugs with undesirable substances - such as cat litter or coffee grounds - and tossing them in the trash in nondescript containers. Doing so should curb prescription-drug abuse and protect lakes and streams from contamination, the White House and government health and environment officials said. Drugs should be flushed down the toilet only if the label says it is safe to do so, according to the guidelines. Some pharmacies also collect drugs for safe disposal.

The government warned that abuse of prescription drugs is increasingly common among teens and young adults. Often those drugs are taken from the medicine cabinets of relatives or friends.

While flushing drugs down the toilet can stem that sort of abuse, it also can create environmental problems. Recent U.S. Geological Survey studies have shown that a wide range of pharmaceuticals and other compounds survive wastewater treatment and later are discharged into lakes, streams and other bodies of water.

## Detoxifying Salt Soak Formula

*Inspired by Home Enlightenment, by Annie B. Bond*

This marvelous soak relaxes muscles, draws toxins from the body, and contains a natural sedative to help your nervous system relax and unwind. It is also a natural emollient and exfoliant—and it reduces swelling. All this in one simple formula!

You may want to keep some of this magic mixture on hand. Try it here:  
INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup sea salt
- 2 cups baking soda
- 1 cup Epsom salts
- 1 to 2 tablespoons pure vegetable glycerin per bath (available from your local health food store)
- 4 to 6 drops essential oil per bath (lavender, sandalwood, or ylang ylang would be nice choices)

1. Combine the dry ingredients in a bowl, stirring to blend. Add 1/4 cup to your bath while the tub fills.
2. Add the glycerin to the bath to prevent drying (feel free to use less if your skin is oily, or more if your skin is dry) and the drops of essential oil.
3. The dry mixture will keep indefinitely in a glass jar with a screw lid. Makes 4 cups (enough for 16 baths).
