Devotional & Church News

It's an election year. A major election year. A presidential election year. Unfortunately it is an election year when a growing number of citizens are increasingly disappointed in our government. The nation's leaders (in this nation as well as every other nation) will one day stand before God and give an account of their leadership. In the meantime we must live through some rather egregious decisions made by politicians and judges. Since God had been eliminated from the decision making process the results have often been disastrous. Not all leaders are corrupt. Some are adequate while others simply are inept. Before we judge them too harshly remember this, we put them there.

Does the church have any part to play in government? The answer is yes and no. Yes, we are to be good citizens, living peacefully, abiding by the laws, and regularly praying effectively for our leaders at every level. No, there are certain functions of government that are outside the responsibilities of the church. The church does not "carry the sword." That is, it is not the duty of the church to provide protection for the citizens of our county, to raise up an army or a police force. This is the government's area of responsibility, to protect its populace and administer justice. Both church and government are established by God. The government protects and administers justice, the church preaches the message of salvation and administer sacraments. One should not assume the functions of the other.

What does the Bible say about this division of jobs? Plenty! There are several references I could cite but I will offer just this lengthy reference from Romans 13:1-7 (HCSB): "Everyone must submit to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except from God, and those that exist are instituted by God. So then, the one who resists the authority is opposing God's command, and those who oppose it will bring judgment on themselves. For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Do you want to be unafraid of the authority? Do what is good and you will have its approval. For government is God's servant, an avenger that brings wrath on the one who does wrong. Therefore, you must submit, not only because of wrath, but also because of your conscience. And for this reason you pay taxes, since the authorities are God's public servants, continually attending to these tasks. Pay your obligations to everyone; taxes to those you owe taxes, tolls to those you owe tolls, respect to those you owe respect and honor to those you owe honor."

This passage may be lengthy but it speaks to all of us concerning our conduct. Notice that three times in these seven verses the Bible says that government is "God's servant." It is implied that the government mentioned here is carrying out the role that God designed it for and not neglecting or abusing its citizens. Applying this to our own country tells me that, even though it is a privilege and not a compulsory law, you owe your vote to one of these presidential candidates. Staying at home on Election Day is a sinful waste of a constitutional right, fought and paid for in blood. We only get the government we deserve. Please don't be so ungrateful and negligent on Election

Day - VOTE!!

One specific way the government provides for our protection is in the establishment of a police force. There is no national police as in some countries. But these men and women face challenges everyday that most would not want to endure. This quote came across the internet recently in response to current happenings. I don't know who wrote it but I think it is worth passing on.

"I've got a real simple message to the players of the National Football League: America can get by without you..... America cannot get by without Law Enforcement.....

At the end of the day when folks are in trouble, they do not call for an overpaid football player.....

They call for an underpaid Police Officer!!!"

Some people simply abuse their privileges by confusing "rights" with "respect" and "responsibility." Just because you think you have the right to do something doesn't mean you should do it!
