4. Your address numbers must be on your home.

5. Basketball hoops, swing sets or

pool toys must be put away every night.

6. Overnight parking on lawns, vacant lots or in the street is not allowed.

7. You are not allowed to work on your cars in your driveway at any time.

Devotional & Church News

November! Traditionally it has become the month of giving; remembering those less fortunate, offering up our time, energies, respect, and fortunes. While giving our monies out of our abundance is desirable when we see someone in need, we also have other assets of great value that can bring honor to the church, praise to God and glory to Jesus Christ, God's only "begotten Son" and our Lord and Savior. When we willingly lay aside (post-pone, reschedule) an activity we would usually engage in we are giving up our time for the benefit of someone else. Taking someone shopping who otherwise couldn't get there; sitting for a while with someone battling a severe medical condition to allow the primary caregiver a few hours to do some personal things or enjoy some "down time" just to relax from the pressures of constant caring. When we use our energies to help a neighbor paint a room, repair a drive-way, put up new drapes, wash their car or vacuum a rug we are following the mandate of our Redeemer to serve one another. When we offer our sincere respect to our men and women in the military or law enforcement we are acknowledging their sacrifice and service on our behalf. WHAT we give and HOW we give is less important than WHY we give. Is our giving done to draw attention to ourselves, to be seen by others, to give us a reason to boast about our generosity and good nature? The praise of men will be all you get. Jesus faulted the Pharisees for such a self-serving

attitude. Or do we give, unnoticed, unpretentious, seeking only the benefit and well-being of another child of God. Is our giving (time, talent, energies, respect, fortunes) known only to Him? Upside Down Thanksgiving Turkey

This turkey, with a stuffing of bread cubes, bacon, sausage, apple, raisins & dried cranberries, is roasted upside-down in an oven-cooking bag.

Ingredients:

- 5 cups cubed stale bread
- 2 cups reduced-sodium chicken broth (or broth from boiling the giblets, not liver, with celery tops)
- 1 cup cooked, crumbled bacon
- 1 cup cooked maple-sage sausage
- 1 cup diced red apple (skin on)
- 1 cup diced celery
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup dried cranberries

- 1 teaspoon dried sage
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon sea salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 turkey—16 to 20 lbs
- 1 cooking bag for a large turkey
- 3 Tablespoons flour
- Salt & pepper

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all stuffing ingredients in a very large bowl. After removing giblets from cavities, pack as much stuffing as will fit nicely inside the turkey. Put any remaining in a pie pan or casserole dish. Cover with foil. Secure cavities closed with needle and thread or skewers. Carefully place turkey in oven bag, breast side down (additional helping hands are good at this point). Sprinkle Flour, Salt and Pepper in and around Turkey. Close oven bag and place Turkey (breast side down) in large roasting pan. Cut a few slits in top of bag. Bake at 350 degrees for 3-3 1/2 hours or until done. Place extra stuffing in oven when there is 3/4 to 1 hour cooking time remaining. Remove turkey and extra stuffing from oven. Allow to cool slightly, about 15 minutes. Carefully remove turkey from oven bag, saving juices for yummy gravy. Scoop out stuffing; carve & serve.
